- * The Kingdom is "among you" (Luke 17.21) because Jesus rules in believers, and through them!



- * Our citizenship in the Kingdom began when we were born into it by the will of God (John 1.12-13).
- We were born to serve the King, but also to rule with Him.



God gave the dominion of the Earth to man (Gen 1.26-28).



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- God, through Christ,disarmed usurpingauthorities (Col. 2.15).



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- * Legally, we have spiritual authority over our planet now (Matthew 28.18-19; Ephesians 1.18 to 2.7).
- * We will receive administrative authority over nations when Jesus returns (Rev 2.26-27; 5.9-10).



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WAIT! Aren't we going to Heaven when we die?

Yes, but Heaven is coming to Earth (Rev 21.2-3). Our future destiny is on the Earth (old Earth and new).



What will our future reign look like?



* It will begin with ministering to traumatized people...





Isaiah 32 describes this time:

Where will we live?






New Jerusalem will not land on Earth; it's a 1,500-mile cube.



New Jerusalem has streets of gold and gates made of giant pearls; it's where our traditional heaven imagery comes from.



Pearls are a symbol of value; no one enters this city who has not recognized the surpassing value of God's Kingdom (Matthew 13.45-46).



- The city is cubical, the shape of the Holy of Holies (1Kings 6.20).
- * No one enters this city who is not holy.



How will we commute between the Heavenly City and Earth?



- In our present bodies,
 we must *move* to
 another place slowly.
- * In our heavenly bodies, we will *think* ourselves to another place instantly (see 1John 3.2).



A more important question: Will we live now in the light of what's ahead?



Paul in Philippians 3.8-11 said:

- ⁸ I count all things to be loss...that I may gain Christ...
- 9 and be found in Him...
- ¹⁰ that I may know Him, and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death;
- in order that I may attain to the resurrection from the dead. (NASB)



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
