



Greek Word Of The Day

ἐλεβοριάω

“I am insane!”

Pronounced: *ěl-lě-bō-rē-ä-ō*.

Hellebore (ἐλλέβορος = *Helleborus orientalis* or *cyclophyllus*) is poisonous, but the ancients used ἐλεβορίτης (wine flavored with hellebore) as a treatment (ἐλεβορισμός) for madness! The Greek verb ἐλεβορίζω means to “dose with hellebore,” or “to bring one to his senses.” An ἐλεβοροδότης was the doctor who prescribed the drinking (ἐλεβοροποσία) of hellebore.

Greek Word Of The Day

ἀγωνίζομαι

“I am engaging in a struggle.”

Pronounced: *a-go-nĩ-zō-mě.*



Greek Word Of The Day

κρίμα

Judgment

Pronounced: *kree-mə*

(rhymes with “cream, uh”).

Imagine a mug that
berates you, and
you’ll understand
what it means to
have

κρίμα

with your coffee!



Greek Phrase Of The Day

τὰ ἔργα

The Works



Pronounced in modern Greek:

tä 'er-gə

(*ta* as in Tahoe, then *air* and *gu* as in airgun).

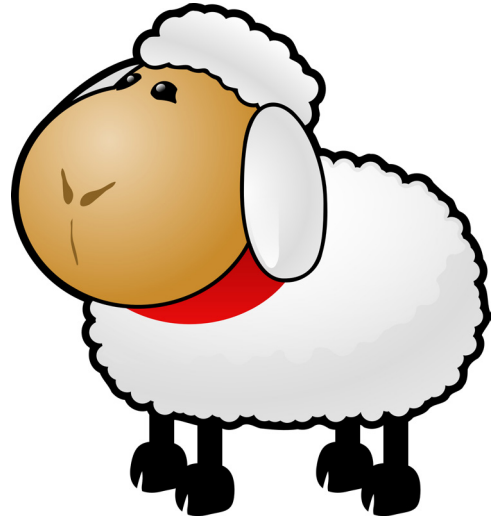
So, next time you're hungry for

τό πρόβατον

The Sheep



Pronounced:
tō 'prō-vä-tōn
(in modern Greek).

Remember, a πρόβατον

is a “pro” at saying,
