Job's Temptation

KEY PRINCIPLE:

Our most persistent temptation is to disengage from God.

Our adversary endeavors to distance our hearts from God through distractions and disappointments. The more we pursue God, the more Satan will seek to separate us from God by a mixture of trials and theological lies. Here are ten powerful lies we need to recognize:

Spiritual Warfare: Job One!

The temptation to withdraw from God often comes at the point when we discover that we can neither manipulate God nor control the circumstances of our lives. (Consider Job's bitter reaction after 7 days of God's inaction.) Also, we become disappointed with God when we discover that our righteousness does not guarantee immunity from casualties in the spiritual battle (See Job 30.25,26, where he complains, "Have I not wept for those in trouble? Has not my soul grieved for the poor? Yet when I hoped for good, evil came; when I looked for light, then came darkness.") Before we know it, we have begun to accuse God in our hearts (Job 40.2). If such disappointments don't turn us from God, Satan can often induce us to disengage from God by getting us to focus on an intermediate enemy. (Job passed this test with respect to the Chaldeans and Sabeans, but was sorely distracted from God by his supposed friends.)

Job's Healing

KEY PRINCIPLE:

Divine healing is normally a corporate battle.

Pertinent Passages:



The secret of perseverance in spiritual warfare is a person.

James 5.11: As you know, we consider blessed those who have persevered. You have heard of Job's perseverance and have seen what the Lord finally brought about. The Lord is full of compassion and mercy.

Job 16.18: "O earth, do not cover my blood; may my cry never be laid to rest!

Job 16.19: Even now my witness is in heaven; my advocate is on high.

Job 16.20: [F. Delitzsch, trans.] Though the mockers of me are my friends—To Eloah mine eyes pour forth tears...

Have you ever felt like giving up on trying to do what's right? Giving up on defending the truth or even giving up in the unending fight against sin? We all know those temptations...

How would we stand up under the attack by Job's friends? They relentlessly pressed him to admit his wickedness, but Job tenaciously maintained his innocence. Job did not claim sinlessness (cf. 13.26; 14.15-17), but only that his integrity was intact before God and that his calamities were not warranted by some secret immorality.

As his accusers verbally pushed him up against a wall of slander and innuendo, Job gave notice that he would fight for his integrity *beyond the grave* if need be, calling upon the earth to not let his righteous life go unvindicated (16.18). Job then called upon his ultimate witness...


